## **Duty, Honour and Bravery Celebrate The Naval Reserve 100th Anniversary**



Bordering the world's two largest oceans and having its longest coastline, Canada has always been a maritime nation. From 1923 to this day, Canada's professional navy has been strengthened by the presence of a volunteer component drawn from the provinces, territories and all walks of life. This remarkable coalition - the Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) and its volunteer component - is best exemplified by the performance of the RCN in the Second World War.

At war time peak, the Royal Canadian Navy had nearly 96,000 personnel; of these, 80,000 were volunteers. The Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve (RCNVR) and Royal Canadian Navy Reserve (RCNR) provided basic training to ultimately crew a fleet

of 400 ships. These ships escorted 25,000 merchantmen on the dreaded North Atlantic Runs, patrolled Canada's coastline, mine-swept the D-Day invasion beaches of Normandy, fought in the Mediterranean as well as landing troops in Italy, and assisted in the sinking of 27 enemy U Boats.

The only Victoria Cross presented to a member of the Royal Canadian Navy in the Second World War was awarded posthumously to Lieutenant(P) Robert Hampton Gray (RCNVR) who although hit and with his aircraft in flames, pressed forward with the attack on an enemy destroyer, sinking it. One of his squadron mates, Lieutenant(P) Gerald Anderson (RCNVR) was killed in the same attack while returning to their aircraft carrier. He was the last Canadian to be killed on operations in the Second World War.

Building on the successes of its forebears, the modern Naval Reserve augments and supports the RCN across the full spectrum of its operations. Whether from deployments in Canada's Arctic, counter-narcotic patrols in the Caribbean Sea and Eastern Pacific, or to counter the growing threat posed to the sovereignty of maritime states, today's Naval Reserve continues this proud volunteer tradition of service.
